



Norway solar panel capacity for home

How many solar plants does Norway have?

Norway reached 597 MW of cumulative installed PV capacity spread across 28,170 solar plants at the end of December, according to new figures from the country's grid operator, Statnett, via its Elhub subsidiary. The country added about 300 MW of new PV installations in 2023. By comparison, it installed 152.7 MW in 2022 and 42.7 in 2021.

Figures from The Norwegian Water Resources and Energy Directorate (NVE) show that solar power capacity in Norway has increased ten-fold since 2015. Despite this, the Scandinavian country still lags behind others.

Is it worth getting solar panels in Norway?

High electricity prices and the urge to go green mean many in Norway are pondering whether it is worth getting solar panels. Solar panels turn the sun's rays into energy which can be sold to the power grid or used for your own home.

How much solar power will Norway have by 2040?

For example, the Norwegian water resources and energy directorate (NVE) has stated that PV contributing with 7 TWh to the Norwegian electricity system by 2040 could be realistic (Lie-Brenna, 2021). The roadmap for the Norwegian PV industry suggests 2-4 TWh by 2030, provided 20-30% annual growth rates (FME-SUSOLTECH & Solenergiklyngen, 2020).

Why is solar power growing in Norway?

Despite the low energy prices, solar power is growing rapidly in Norway. In 2016 four times as much capacity was installed as the year before, mostly on commercial buildings and private homes connected to the grid. Norwegian companies are also important players in the production of crude silicon and silicon wafers for the solar cell industry.

Why are new solar installations gaining popularity in Norway?

Due to the high cost of electricity, there is currently a strong demand for new solar installations. Between January 2023 and early June 2023, Norway added 101 MW of new solar PV capacity, bringing the country's total installed solar PV capacity to 459 MW as of June 2023.

The average cost for a residential solar panel system in Norway can range from 40,000 to 130,000 Norwegian kroner (NOK). This translates roughly to USD 4,500 to USD 14,700. Additional points to consider: There are currently no direct government incentives for installing solar panels in Norway.

The solar energy market is growing rapidly in Norway. According to Blackridge Research, the total solar power installed capacity in Norway is expected to increase from 358 MW in 2022 to 4,943 MW by 2028.

Solar photovoltaic power capacity in Norway peaked at 616 megawatts in 2023, an increase when compared to the previous year. In the period of consideration, figures presented a trend of steady growth.

Solar energy is expected to be a key driver of renewable energy growth in the energy transition. In this report we look at the Norwegian conditions to engage in solar energy both nationally and internationally. The Norwegian solar energy industry is growing and highly varied.

Norway ranks 70th in the world for cumulative solar PV capacity, with 225 total MW's of solar PV installed. This means that 0.10% of Norway's total energy as a country comes from solar PV (that's 42nd in the world).

As long as solar power plants are placed where the sun shines, they can theoretically be installed on virtually any surface. Even if the land area around cities and industrial centres is limited, there is still plenty of space on the surface of the sea.
